Preamble

The state is also out of compliance if any section of this report relevant to the state's program is incomplete.

- 1. What other strategies does your state use to measure and report on access to, quality, or outcomes of care received by your CHIP population? What have you found? **[7500]** In each of the last 17 years, the Office of Medicaid Policy and Planning (OMPP) has contracted with an outside vendor to conduct an independent evaluation of the CHIP program. The findings from this evaluation are presented in a report to the Indiana Legislature. The 2016 evaluation was submitted to the Legislature and has been included in this report as Attachment A. Refer to Question #4 below for findings.
- 2. What strategies does your CHIP program have for future measurement and reporting on access to, quality, or outcomes of care received by your CHIP population? When will data be available? [7500]

The OMPP had in place numerous initiatives related to outcomes for the CHIP population as part of its overall quality strategy for children. Specifically, targeted areas of focus for the Hoosier Healthwise (HHW) program—of which CHIP members are enrolled in—include pay-for-performance in the MCO contracts for Well-Child Visits (including the HEDIS measures for First 15 Months of Life, 6 or More Visits; Third through Sixth Years of Life; and Adolescent Well-Care Visits). Other initiatives in HHW pertaining to children are to improve the EPSDT participation rate, Follow-up After Hospitalization for Mental Illness within 7 Days, reduction in the level of inappropriate Emergency Department use and targets against HEDIS benchmarks for prenatal and post-partum care.

3. Have you conducted any focused quality studies on your CHIP population, e.g., adolescents, attention deficit disorder, substance abuse, special heath care needs or other emerging health care needs? What have you found? [7500]

As part of its External Quality Review (EQR) this past year, the OMPP's External Quality Review Organization (Burns & Associates, or B&A) conducted a study on lead testing rates at the county and zip code level. The prevalence of elevated lead levels was also examined over the last five years. B&A utilized claims submitted by providers to the managed care entities (MCEs) as well as data submitted to the Indiana State Department of Health's (ISDH's) lead test registry.

One key finding found was that in the most recent time period (Jan 2016 to July 2017), tests reported to the ISDH for Medicaid children with elevated lead levels was near 1% of all tests reported. In previous years, it was higher than this. However, it was determined that the higher rate was due to the fact that many providers were non-compliant in submitting low lead level tests into the ISDH database. The limited reporting to the ISDH was further proven by the fact that the MCEs had more lead tests in its claims database paid to providers than were submitted to the ISDH.

Concurrent with the EQR, the ISDH, the OMPP and the MCEs have been collaborating to engage with the providers who had previously been non-compliant in submitting the results of lead tests to the ISDH database. B&A provided information at the county level showing gaps between reporting of lead tests by claims and to the ISDH database. The state agencies and the MCEs are working to close these gaps to capture more data in an effort to improve the lead testing rate statewide.

Attachment A: Independent Evaluation of the Indiana Children's Health Insurance Program for CY 2016

The Independent Evaluation reported on enrollment trends in Indiana's CHIP, access to services and utilization trends, and results from HEDIS measures and a CAHPS Child survey. Related to the CAHPS survey, composite scores were tabulated on a number of measures. All three managed care entities (MCEs) scored 87 percent or higher on Rating of Health Care, Rating of Personal Doctor and Rating of Health Plan. All three MCEs scored responses of "usually" or

"always" near 90% of the time for the measure on Customer Service and above 90 percent on Getting Care Quickly.

Related to accessibility of services, an analysis was completed to determine where CHIP members receive primary services and preventive dental services. Claims of actual services received were matched between where the member lives and where the attending provider is located. Statewide, the average distance that CHIP members travel to seek primary care is 21.1 miles, up from the 16.7 mile average reported in the previous year's report but below the 30 mile threshold set by the OMPP. For dental providers, the average distance that CHIP members travel to seek dental care is 14.1 miles, which is the same as reported in the previous year's report and far below the threshold of 30 miles set by the OMPP.

Related to utilization, the percentage of CHIP children enrolled at least nine months in FFYs 2014, 2015 and 2016 in Indiana's CHIP were reviewed to see how many used primary care services, emergency room visits, preventive dental visits, or had a pharmacy script during these time periods. The overall rate of usage for primary care visits was 65-68% in each of the three years; emergency room visits decreased slightly from 25% in FFY 2014 to 23% in FFY 2016; preventive dental visit use was unchanged at 66%; and pharmacy scripts remained steady at 66% as well.

The report also includes comparisons across various demographic cohorts, such as by MCE, by age and by race/ethnicity.

Some of the key findings from these analyses are:

- ? Primary care visits were more prevalent among the youngest members, as 76 percent of children ages 5 and younger had a visit in FFY 2016. The percentage was lower for children in the other age groups (63 percent).
- ? When comparing the rates across race/ethnicities, Caucasian children were more likely to have had a primary care visit (74 percent in FFY 2016) than other race/ethnicities (55 to 57 percent).
- ? There is also a disparity in the number of visits per 1,000 CHIP children for primary care. The rate for Caucasian children is 233 visits per 1,000 children during FFY 2016, whereas the rates for African American and Hispanic children were 144 and 148, respectively.
- ? The rate of emergency room visits by CHIP children decreased slightly from FFY 2015 to FFY 2016. Just less than one quarter of all CHIP children who were enrolled at least nine months in the year had an ER visit. There was a difference in utilization when measured on a per 1,000 basis for each MCE. One MCE had a rate of 25 visits per 1,000; the other two MCEs each had a rate of 34 per 1,000 in FFY 2016.
- ? Differences in emergency room use are found by age group within the CHIP. The highest use is among children under age 5 (32 percent of all members in FFY 2016) and lowest among children ages 6 to 12 (21 percent of all members in FFY 2016).
- ? The percentage of members using the emergency room was almost identical across race/ethnicities. There are differences, however, in emergency room use at the county level with higher use in the East Central and West Central regions of the state.
- ? Hispanic CHIP children were more likely than children of other races/ethnicities to have a preventive dental visit with a rate of 73 percent in FFY 2016 than other race/ethnicities (63 to 64 percent).

We have maintained our CHIP program without needing to limit enrollment and have not expended all allocated CHIP funds, while experiencing growth to be at an all time high. Additionally, over 95% of children in Indiana were insured for the first time in the history of the state.
