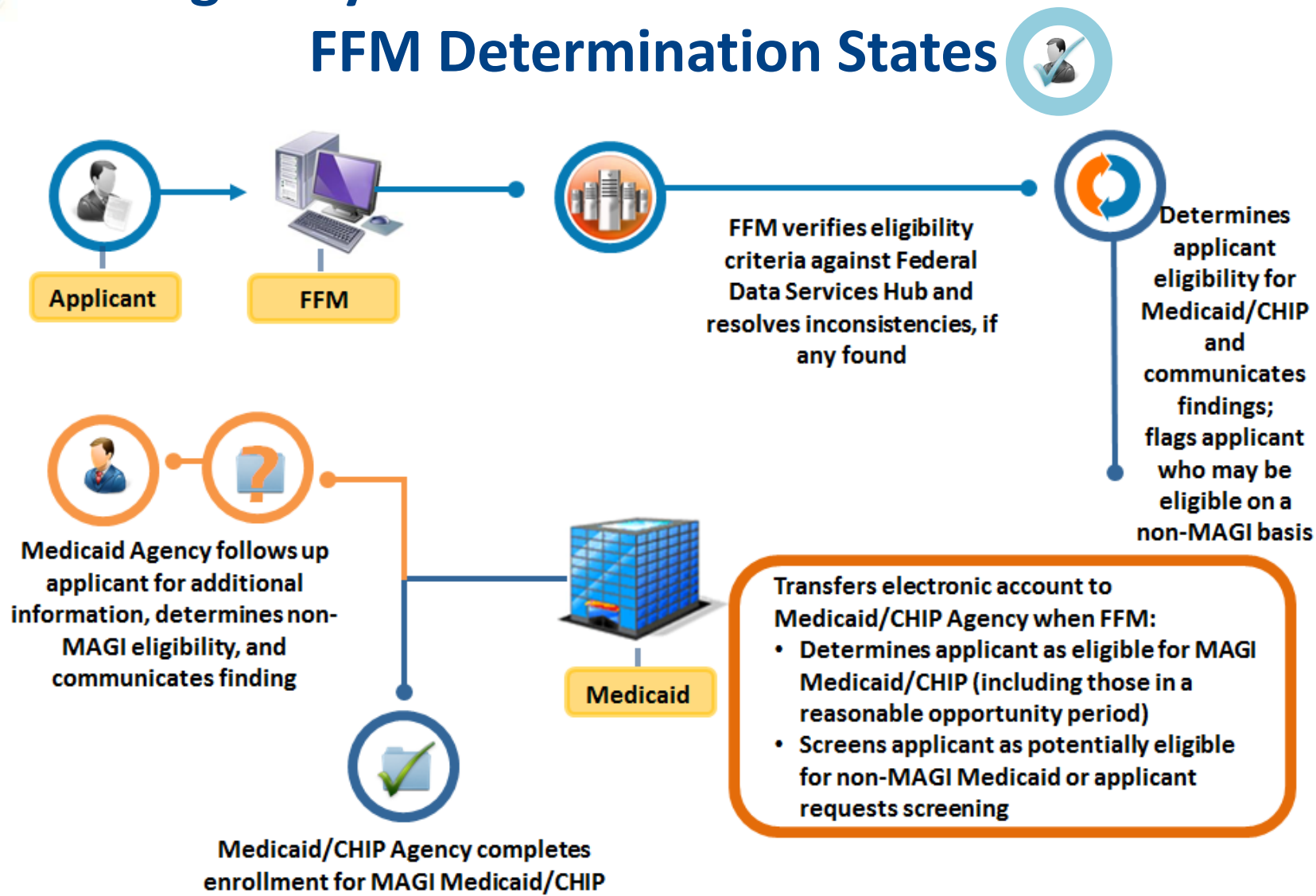

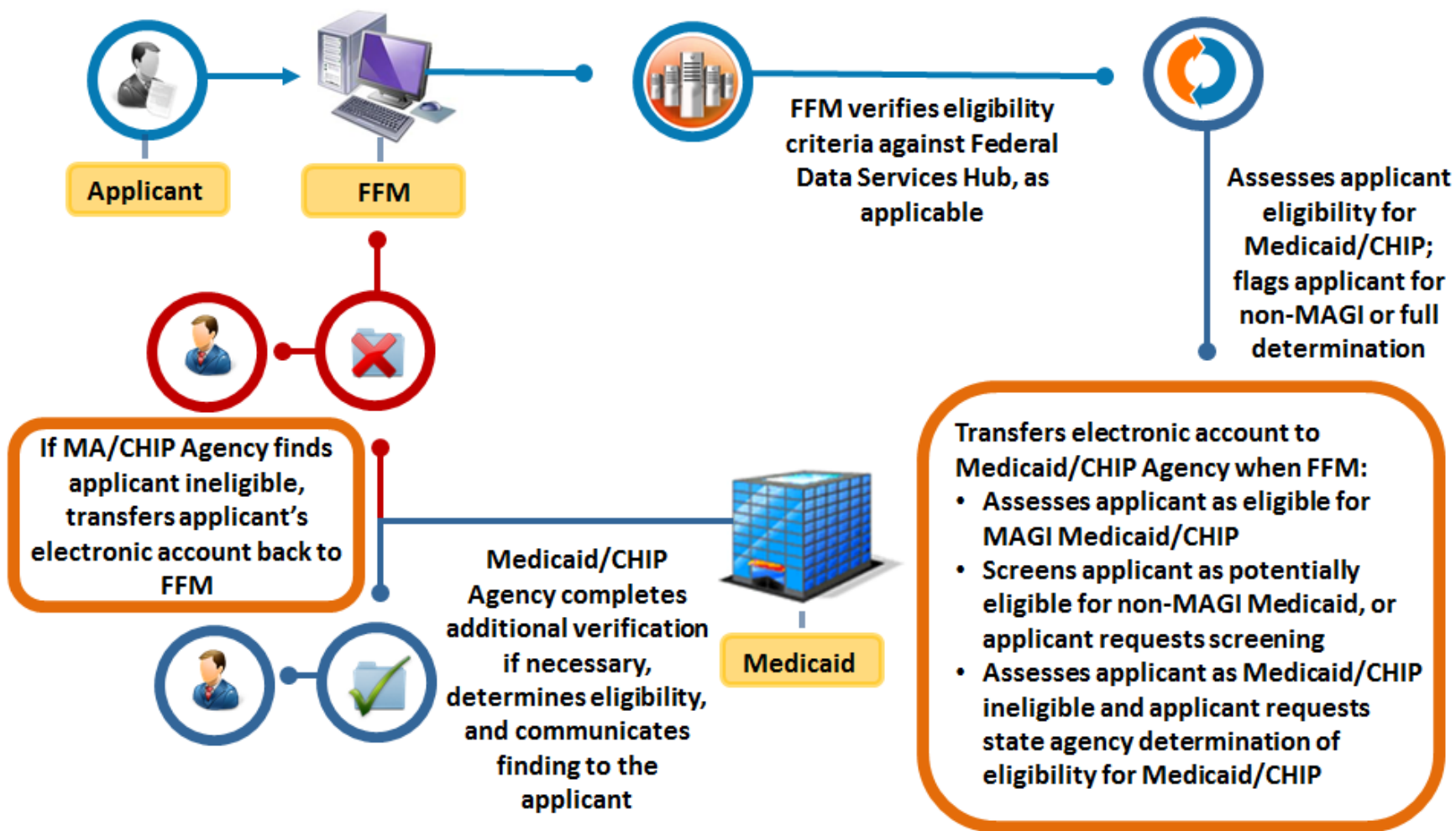
Meeting Objectives

- Discuss policy and operational challenges resulting from the high volume of Open Enrollment Period (OEP) applications to States, and Medicaid/CHIP Account Transfers (AT) from the FFM.
- To identify practical strategies to manage application volume and facilitate timely enrollment of Medicaid/CHIP eligible individuals:
 - Enhanced flat file strategies
 - AT strategies
 - Other application strategies

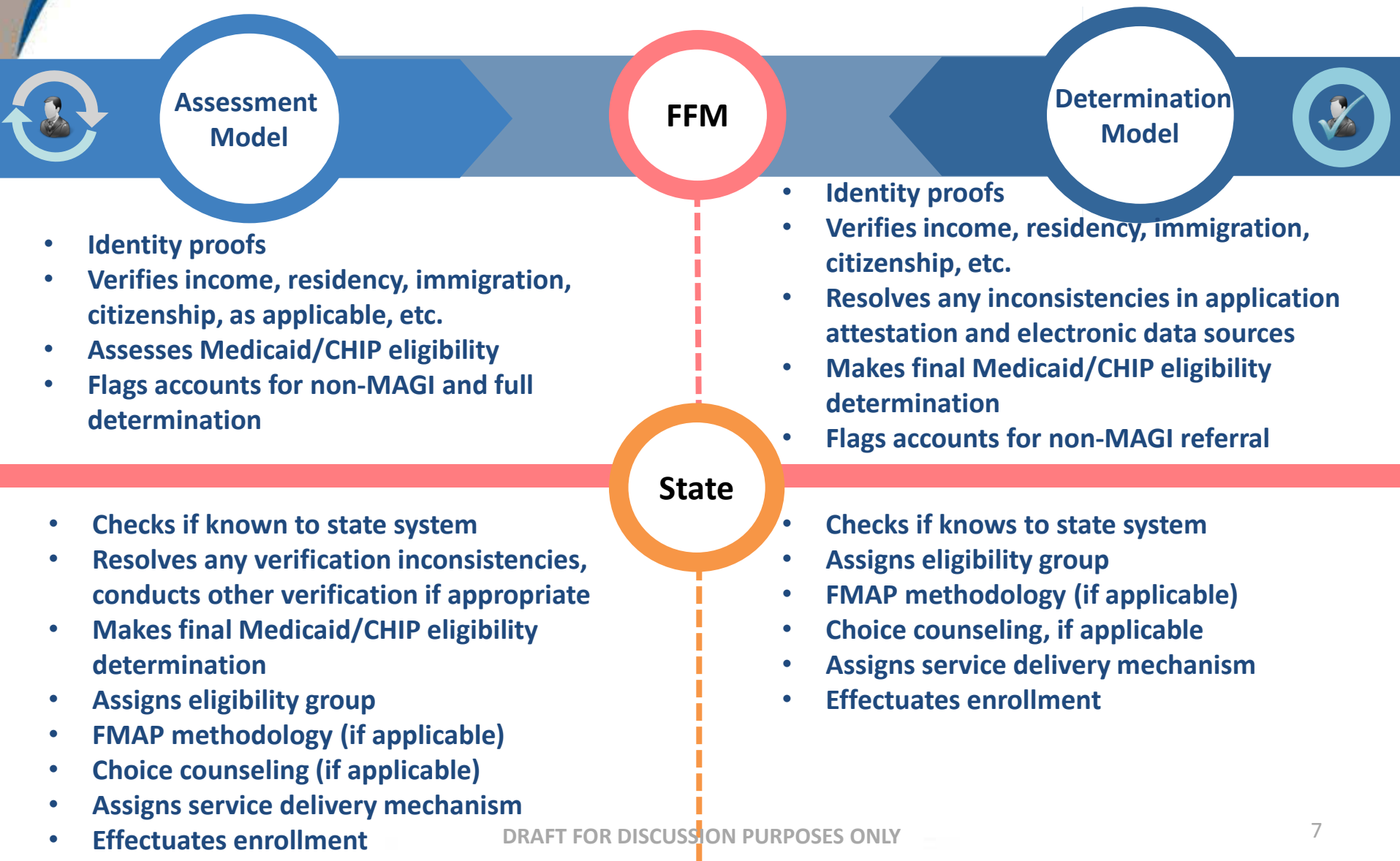
Eligibility & Enrollment Process Flow for FFM Determination States

Types of Accounts



MAGI Medicaid/CHIP Eligible

Individual has been determined or assessed eligible for MAGI Medicaid/CHIP

- *Determination and Assessment States*



Non-MAGI Medicaid Referral

Individual flagged for non-MAGI screening through application questions or requests non-MAGI referral. May also have been determined MAGI eligible.

- *Determination and Assessment States*



MAGI Medicaid/CHIP Ineligible but Requested State Agency


Determination Individual was assessed ineligible for Medicaid/CHIP but requested a Medicaid/CHIP determination from the State Agency (Applicant can enroll in APTC/CSR in the meantime)

- *Assessment States only*

State Systems Readiness

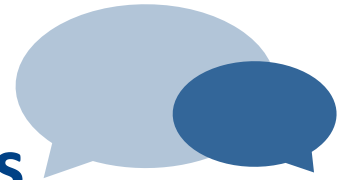
Manual versus Automated Capability?

- **Account Transfer receipt (FFM → State)**
- **Account Processing capacity**
 - Match against existing eligibility records
 - Upload or update account information in state eligibility system
 - Apply additional eligibility rules
 - Verification
 - Determination
 - Notice

 *States will need to acknowledge receipt and communicate outcome (accepted, provisionally accepted, rejected)*
- **Account Transfer transmission (State → FFM)**

Use Expanded Flat File

Applicants Already Enrolled in Medicaid/CHIP

Approach to Non-MAGI

Fast Track Determination for Applications without Inconsistencies (aligned with verification plan)

Enroll or Verify Using Existing State Data

Use Expanded Flat File

Strategy

- Enroll applicants determined or assessed eligible for Medicaid/CHIP without inconsistencies based on the expanded flat file to:
 - Expedite enrollment and access to coverage
 - Focus resources on non-MAGI and other applications coming into agency [Determination States]
 - Distribute AT workload [Assessment States]

Conditions Supporting Adoption

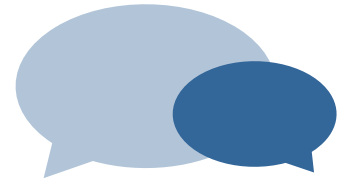
- State unable to receive AT (and extended timeline to achieve capability)
- State unable to automatically process AT (and extended timeline to achieve capability)
- Systems capability for processing expanded flat file

Considerations

- State will need to obtain 1902(e)(14) waiver authority
- State still needs to process AT
- Applicant becomes “known to State system” and requires reconciliation upon AT processing

Use Expanded Flat File



- After reviewing the flat file parameters and enhanced data fields, will your state be able to use the Expanded Flat File? How?
 - Not at all
 - For workload planning
 - To sort/clean/prioritize accounts
 - To enroll individuals determined/assessed eligible for Medicaid/CHIP without inconsistencies
 - Other?
- Will using the Expanded Flat File help to make managing the full account transfer more efficient?
 - Are there ways that CMS can state facilitate adoption of this strategy?

Applicants Already Enrolled in Medicaid/CHIP

Strategy

- Send notice to individual that they are currently enrolled and remind them of renewal date
- Utilize FFM-verified data to provide renewal for 12 months

Conditions Supporting Adoption

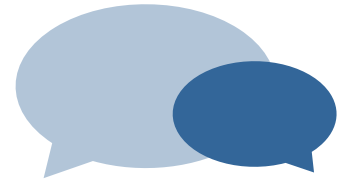
- Automated identification of “duplicates” or applicants who are already enrolled in Medicaid/CHIP
- For 12-month extension of renewal period, state accepts FFM data without further verification

Considerations

- State may need to modify verification plan
- Enables state to prioritize processing for those without coverage

Applicants Already Enrolled in Medicaid/CHIP



- How does your state handle duplicate/known applicants now?
 - Does your current process inform how AT duplicates will be handled?
- How will your state identify duplicates or applicants in AT who are already known to Medicaid? Will this check be automated or manual?
- If your state is able to identify these accounts, how will you handle duplicate applications from the FFM?

Approach to Non-MAGI

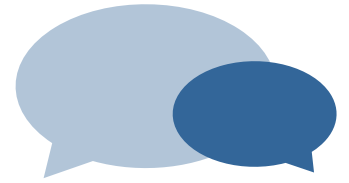
Strategy

- At a minimum, notice consumer explaining non-MAGI application process
- Issue supplemental information request
- Request completion of ABD application

Considerations

- State may prioritize pool of non-MAGI applicants
- State may have non-integrated MAGI and non-MAGI eligibility systems
- Consumers may not understand implications of non-MAGI determination request

Fast Track Determination of AT Applications without Inconsistencies

Strategy

- Enroll MAGI eligible applicants without inconsistencies; can conduct additional state verifications post-eligibility
- Deny MAGI ineligible applicants without inconsistencies

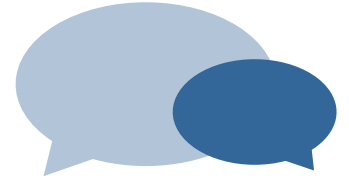
Conditions Supporting Adoption

- Assessment state
- State verification plan accepts FFM data without additional verification (i.e. income)
- State decides to accept FFM data without additional verification for an interim period
- Additional state verifications are manual

Considerations

- State may need to establish process for conducting post-eligibility verification
- State may need to modify verification plan

Enroll or Verify Using Existing State Data (through AT or Expanded Flat File)

Strategy

- *Currently receiving SNAP/other state program:*
 - “Fast-track” enroll individual based on SNAP/other state program data
- *Currently or previously received SNAP/other state program:*
 - Verify applicant eligibility by relying on current or previously provided information (within a certain timeframe defined by state)

Conditions Supporting Adoption

- State Medicaid/CHIP system able to automatically access data for applicants known to other human services programs (e.g., states with horizontally integrated eligibility systems)
- Assessment state

Considerations

- State will need to pursue 1902(e)(4) waiver to adopt “fast track” enrollment procedures
- State may need to modify verification plan

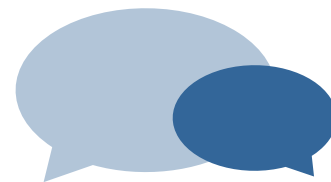
