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RE: SECTION 1115 DEMONSTRATION (11-W-00001/9) RENEWAL APPLICATION


Enclosed is the State of Hawaii's application for a renewal of its Section 1115 Demonstration. For nearly twenty years, the Demonstration has made it possible for the State to provide comprehensive medical assistance to low-income residents of Hawaii, while controlling costs for both the state and federal governments. Hawaii seeks a five-year renewal under the terms and conditions described in its application, which include coverage for low-income adults consistent with the Medicaid expansion, as well as the other programmatic changes specified in the Affordable Care Act. The State requests this renewal under Section 1115(a) of the Social Security Act.

I am a strong supporter of President Obama and the Affordable Care Act (ACA). Hawaii was the first state to commit to implementing a state-based health insurance exchange and will expand Medicaid eligibility. This renewal application contemplates an effective date of January 1, 2014. However, subject to the approval of the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services, Hawaii requests to implement the changes in this renewal effective October 1, 2013, when it will be required to begin evaluating new applications under the modified adjusted gross income (MAGI) methodology, to facilitate its implementation of ACA requirements.
