

This letter is to inform you that the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) is granting a temporary extension of Indiana's non-emergency medical transportation (NEMT) waiver as a part of Indiana's section 1115 demonstration, entitled "Healthy Indiana Plan 2.0" (HIP 2.0) (Project No. 11-W-00296/5) which is due to expire November 30, 2016 until January 31, 2018. The demonstration will continue to operate under the authority of section 1115(a) of the Social Security Act. Additionally the current list of expenditure authorities and special terms and conditions will continue to apply to the NEMT waiver until January 31, 2018.

In a letter dated December 22, 2015, in which CMS extended the NEMT waiver to November 30, 2016, we stated that we would be considering the results of the federal evaluation in our decision to extend the NEMT waiver. However, we are still working with you to complete the necessary steps to execute the federal evaluation design in order to analyze the impact of the NEMT waiver. Therefore, we are granting a temporary extension of the NEMT waiver through the end of the demonstration period, January 31, 2018.
