- The populations outlined below will be added to the Texas Medicaid state plan and 1115 demonstration waiver pursuant to the Affordable Care Act (ACA).
- With the exception of the conversion to a modified adjusted gross income standard effective January 1, 2014 and the populations outlined below, no additional eligibility changes are being made to the 1115 waiver populations.
- The state will collect the information necessary for a MAGI determination at a beneficiary's first renewal in 2014. Beneficiaries do not need to take any action to maintain eligibility outside of the standard redetermination process.
- The state will check a beneficiary for eligibility under other MAGI categories prior to termination. However, the state will not be able to check for eligibility on a non-MAGI basis prior to terminating the beneficiary since Texas does not have on record all of the information necessary for a non-MAGI determination for all beneficiaries.
- The state currently uses a partially pre-populated renewal form. Texas is working on a timeline for implementation of fully pre-populated renewal forms.
- From October 1 through December 31, 2013, the state will not transfer accounts to the Marketplace. During this time period, denial notices will be sent to applicants who are ineligible for Medicaid that direct beneficiaries to the Marketplace. The state will help to direct denied applicants to Healthcare.gov. Beginning on January 2014, the state will transfer accounts to the Marketplace.

Upon enrollment or re-enrollment, individuals will be screened using the streamlined application as required by ACA, or the integrated application (no new application will be needed for re-enrollment). **Transition Process** rules, MAGI rules will be applied.

Beginning October 1, 2013, HHSC will conduct screening using current eligibility rules and if found ineligible under existing

Consistent with current enrollment practices, eligible individuals will be provided choice of managed care plan. The enrollment broker will also provide information on Medicaid benefits, and assist with selecting a doctor. If the selected Medicaid managed care plan differs from the previous CHIP managed care plan, medical history on the individual will be provided for continuity of care.

Texas currently covers MTFCY ages 18 up to 21 and FFCHE ages 21 up to age 23. These populations are not currently in the 1115 demonstration waiver. Eligible individuals in these groups will be identified and transitioned to the Medicaid former foster care children's group beginning January 1, 2014. Notification will be sent to these individuals prior to the transition in January 1, 2014.

Three months prior to any individual within this group transitioning to a different program, benefit and plan information will be provided by the enrollment broker. Consistent with current enrollment practices, eligible individuals will be provided choice of managed care plan.

If the selected Medicaid managed care plan differs from the previous managed care plan, medical history on the individual will be provided for continuity of care.
