On March 27, 2014, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) received Kansas' State Plan Amendment (SPA) transmittal #14-0007-MM6, which describes the Medicaid requirements related to citizenship and non-citizen eligibility. The citizenship and immigration status requirements are set forth at 1902(a)(46)(B) and 1903(v)(2),(3), and (4) of the Act and in 42 CFR § 435.4, 435.406, and 435.956.

SPA 14-0007-MM6 was approved on April 6, 2014, with an effective date of January 1, 2014, as requested by the state. Enclosed is a copy of the CMS-179 summary form, as well as the approved pages for incorporation into the Kansas State Plan.

We do not require any further action on the part of the state in relation to the approval of this state plan amendment. However, as outlined in the state's responses to the RAI received on February 17, 2015, the state has committed to working with CMS on the implementation of the Operational Advanced Planning Document (OAPD) for the Kansas Eligibility and Enrollment System (KEES) related to the use of the Federal Data Services Hub to verify citizenship and satisfactory immigration status.
