I am writing to inform you that the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) has approved your title XXI Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) state plan amendment (SPA) number ME-17-0003, submitted on December 5, 2017, with an effective date of July 1, 2017.

This SPA allows CHIP eligibility for all children with access to public employee coverage on the basis of a family member's employment who are otherwise eligible targeted low-income children as defined at 42 CFR 457.310, provided that the child's household income meets the same income standards as those applied to targeted low-income children under the CHIP state plan. The state will provide this coverage under the hardship exception to the exclusion of employees of a public agency of a state, in accordance with section 2110(b)(6)(C) of the Social Security Act. The SPA ME-17-0003 supersedes the current information on dependents of public employees in the CHIP state plan.

In addition, the SPA adds an exception to the state's 90-day waiting period for a period of one year from the approval date of this SPA for children of state employees to enroll in CHIP. As such, this SPA supersedes the current information on waiting period exceptions in the current CHIP state plan and on page CS20.
