

Medication Therapy Management Services.

Medication therapy management (MTM) services are provided by qualified, Missouri licensed pharmacists to non-managed care MO HealthNet participants to optimize therapeutic outcomes and reduce the incidence of morbidity associated with chronic conditions or inappropriate use of medications. A web-based tool (CyberAccess) is utilized by MO HealthNet for an array of provider services, including MTM services. MTM services are initiated by a clinically-based rules engine that juries participant claims history, including medication and diagnostic information in conjunction with nationally accepted evidence-based guidelines, to flag specific patients for potential MTM interventions.

Pharmacists are notified of a potential MTM intervention via a point-of-sale message when filling a prescription, or the pharmacist may log on to CyberAccess to retrieve a list of potential MTM interventions. If the pharmacist chooses to accept an MTM intervention opportunity, such intervention may include the performance of a wide variety of MTM services to address specific treatment needs, such as:

- Counseling participants on the importance of medication adherence (alerting participants to missed dosages and refills),
- Providing medication education,
- Providing self-care education for specific chronic conditions,
- Contacting physicians to schedule diagnostic testing,
- Contacting physicians to make drug therapy recommendations, or
- Connecting participants with other community-based resources as needed.

To be eligible for participation in the MO HealthNet MTM program, a provider must be a qualified Missouri licensed pharmacist and have an active MO HealthNet provider status, and must have successfully completed two hours of ACPE (Accreditation Counsel for Pharmacy Education) accredited continuing education focused on the administration of MTM approved by the MO HealthNet Division. Once the qualified pharmacist accepts a specific MTM intervention opportunity, he/she will then notify the participant and offer the MTM service.

The service is comprised of the following components:

- A. Assessing a participant's health status;
- B. Developing a medication treatment plan;
- C. Monitoring and evaluating a participant's response to therapy;
- D. Providing a comprehensive medication review to identify, resolve, and prevent medication-related problems;
- E. Documenting the care provided and communicating essential information to a participant's primary care providers;
- F. Providing oral education and training to enhance participant understanding and appropriate use of medications;
- G. Providing information, support services, and resources to enhance participant adherence to therapeutic regimens;
- H. Coordinating and integrating MTM services within the broader health care services provided to a participant.

Medication Therapy Management (MTM) – Payment to Providers

Qualified enrolled pharmacists will submit claims for MTM services using the following procedure codes and descriptions for corresponding payment amounts:

99605 – Medication therapy management service(s) provided by a pharmacist, individual, face-to-face with patient, with assessment and intervention if provided; initial 15 minutes, new patient.

This code is payable only one time per participant per lifetime.

Fee = \$50.00 (Not subject to cost-sharing)

99606 - Medication therapy management service(s) provided by a pharmacist, individual, face-to-face with patient, with assessment and intervention if provided; initial 15 minutes, established patient.

This code may be billed one time per calendar month per participant per intervention.

Fee = \$10.00 (Not subject to cost-sharing)

99607 – each additional 15 minutes (List separately in addition to code for primary service)

This code is an add-on code and must be used in conjunction with 99605 or 99606.

Fee = \$5.00 (Not subject to cost-sharing)

Individual qualified pharmacists may be reimbursed for a maximum of 60 minutes of MTM services per month per participant.

Program Documentation

The pharmacist participating in this program must maintain the documentation to support the claims submitted to the MO HealthNet Division. Appropriate documentation includes a log of all MTM interventions, including patient name, patient signature, date and time of intervention and any other desired information relating to the specific intervention.
