The State of North Carolina will limit coverage for family planning-related services (inter-periodic visits) based on the potential for over-scheduling of unnecessary visits for beneficiaries and abuse by physicians. North Carolina will provide coverage of family planning visits should be due to the medical necessity of the beneficiary. The State will cover a total of a six inter-periodic visit limitation annually, not to include the annual exam, which is also considered to be a periodic visit. The State's limitations on the number of family planning visits per beneficiary is based on historical utilization of family planning services under the waiver demonstration, which has consistently shown an average of no more than two visits per beneficiary per year.

4.c.(ii) Family planning-related services provided under the above State Eligibility Option

Under the State Eligibility Option for Family Planning Services, the State will cover screening and treatment for sexually transmitted infections, which will be performed pursuant to or subsequent to an annual exam. The State will also cover screening for HIV, which will be performed pursuant to or subsequent to an annual exam.

The result is that screening and treatment for sexually transmitted infections will be covered during the annual exam or during in any or all of the six subsequent inter-periodic visits allowed under the program. Screening for HIV will be covered during the annual exam or during any or all of the six subsequent inter-periodic visits allowed under the program.
