




August 2023 Medicaid and CHIP Enrollment Trends Snapshot



Center for Medicaid and CHIP Services

Enrollment Snapshot

- To monitor states' progress after the end of the Medicaid continuous enrollment condition and states' return to regular eligibility operations, including conducting full renewals, this Enrollment Snapshot captures high level information on the most recently submitted month of Performance Indicator Enrollment Data¹ within the context of trends prior to the COVID-19 public health emergency (PHE), as well as trends prior to the end of the Medicaid continuous enrollment condition,^{2,3} focusing on:
 - Total Medicaid and CHIP enrollment;
 - Medicaid enrollment;
 - CHIP enrollment;
 - Adult enrollment; and
 - Child enrollment.
- This analysis also captures high level information on the trend in the number of Medicaid and CHIP applications received by states.

¹ Performance Indicator Enrollment Data counts individuals receiving full-scope and comprehensive Medicaid and CHIP benefits.

² February 2020 serves as the baseline prior to the impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and the enactment of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) in March 2020. March 2023 serves as the baseline before states began disenrolling individuals from Medicaid coverage after the end of the Medicaid continuous enrollment condition. Key Findings

- In August 2023, **89,994,594** individuals were enrolled in Medicaid and CHIP.¹
 - 83,029,628 individuals were enrolled in Medicaid in August 2023, a decrease of 1,488,269 individuals (1.8%) from July 2023.
 - 6,964,966 individuals were enrolled in CHIP in August 2023, a decrease of 30,312 individuals (0.4%) from July 2023.²
- As of August 2023, enrollment in Medicaid and CHIP has decreased by **3,862,970** individuals since March 2023, the final month of the Medicaid continuous enrollment condition under the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) and amended by the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023.³
 - Medicaid enrollment has decreased by 3,699,342 individuals (4.3%).
 - CHIP enrollment has decreased by 163,628 individuals (2.3%).
- Between February 2020 and March 2023, enrollment in Medicaid and CHIP increased by 22,982,495 individuals (32.4%) to 93,857,564.⁴
 - Medicaid enrollment increased by 22,649,177 individuals (35.3%).
 - CHIP enrollment increased by 333,318 individuals (4.9%).

Key Findings (continued)


- In August 2023, 2,982,616 applications for Medicaid and CHIP were submitted directly to states.¹
 - The number of applications submitted directly to states was 6.0 percent higher in August 2023 compared to July 2023.
- In August 2023, 189,846 applications were transferred from the Federally Facilitated Marketplace (FFM)
 to states.²
 - The number of transferred applications was 19.3 percent higher in August 2023 compared to July 2023.



Figure 1. National Medicaid and CHIP enrollment, February 2020 to August 2023, CMS Performance Indicator Data





For additional information on Medicaid and CHIP enrollment from December 2019 to August 2023, please see Appendix B. **Data Context:** The August 2023 decrease in CHIP enrollment is primarily driven by Virginia and Georgia. In Virginia, CHIP enrollment decreased by 4.1 percent (7,884 individuals). In Georgia, CHIP enrollment decreased by 5.0 percent (16,030 individuals).

Nationally, total Medicaid and CHIP enrollment decreased by 1.7 percent from July 2023 to August 2023. In 4 states, total Medicaid and CHIP enrollment increased by less than 2 percent. In 22 states, total Medicaid and CHIP enrollment decreased by less than 2 percent. In 18 states and the District of Columbia, total Medicaid and CHIP enrollment decreased between 2 to 5 percent. In 6 states, total Medicaid and CHIP enrollment decreased by more than 5 percent. (1)





Data Context: (1) In Idaho, total Medicaid and CHIP enrollment decreased by 5.1 percent (18,523 individuals). In Montana, total Medicaid and CHIP enrollment decreased by 5.2 percent (15,206 individuals). In Georgia, total Medicaid and CHIP enrollment decreased by 5.8 percent (144,533 individuals). In Kansas, total Medicaid and CHIP enrollment decreased by 6.8 percent (32,161 individuals). In Arkansas, total Medicaid and CHIP enrollment decreased by 1.8 percent (9,868 individuals).


Figure 4. National Medicaid and CHIP applications submitted directly to states from 2019 to 2023, CMS Performance Indicator Data

Applications transferred from the FFM are not included. This analysis includes preliminary data from 50 states and the District of Columbia. Fluctuations in state-reported Medicaid and CHIP applications may be observed throughout a given year as a result of open enrollment activities or other seasonal changes.

Data Context: Tennessee did not report applications in January and February 2019. Maine did not report applications in June 2020. Kansas did not report applications from January 2019 to April 2023.

Nationally, the number of Medicaid and CHIP applications submitted directly to states was about 6.0 percent higher in August 2023 compared to July 2023. In 3 states and the District of Columbia, applications decreased by less than 30 percent. In Florida and New Mexico, applications increased by less than 10 percent. In 41 states, applications increased between 10 to 30 percent. In 4 states, applications increased by more than 30 percent. (1)





Data Context: (1) In Delaware, applications increased by 32.0 percent (1,057 applications). In Maine, applications increased by 40.4 percent (2,234 applications). In Michigan, applications increased by 41.7 percent (10,466 applications). In Wyoming, applications increased by 43.0 percent (461 applications).

Background

- This is a Center for Medicaid & CHIP Services (CMCS) Medicaid and CHIP Coverage Learning
 Collaborative (MAC LC) project that monitors Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP)
 enrollment trends, primarily using the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) Performance
 Indicator Data.
- The MAC LC is a CMCS project that provides a forum for facilitated discussion and learning across CMS and states, with the goal of implementing and improving the programs, tools, and systems needed to ensure high-performing state health insurance programs. The MAC LC has enabled CMS to more effectively identify issues and also monitor and improve program performance.
- This snapshot is a companion to the August 2023 Medicaid & CHIP Application, Eligibility, and Enrollment Data posted on <u>Medicaid.gov</u>.
- The Enrollment Trends project primarily relies on Performance Indicator Data. All states—including the
 District of Columbia—provide data each month about their Medicaid and CHIP eligibility and enrollment
 activity. These data reflect a range of indicators related to key application, eligibility, and enrollment
 processes within the state Medicaid and CHIP agency. The complete data set is available on
