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Crosswalk between Current and Planned CMCS Activities and Expert Panel Identified Strategies

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), Center for Medicaid & CHIP Services (CMCS) and partner, Provider Resources, Inc., collaborated with individual experts in the field of maternal and infant health outcomes (*Expert Panel for Improving Maternal and Infant Health Outcomes*) to identify potential payment and policy options across four core areas ripe for improvement in the near term.

- Enhanced Maternal Care Management: Strategies for management of high risk pregnancies, considering care during inter-conception, preconception and postpartum intervals
- Effective Reproductive Health Enablers: Policies to ensure that reproductive services reach those of highest risk of preterm birth
- **Perinatal Payment Strategies**: Payment packaging that would provide incentives for implementing evidence-based care at hospital and clinician provider levels
- **Data Measurement and Reporting**: Measurement strategies for Medicaid that enhance federal and national measurement initiatives, including the CMCS maternal and infant health core measures, and support other expert panel strategies

Across these core areas, policy and payment options were identified that have the potential to improve perinatal outcomes in Medicaid and CHIP. Actions may be taken using federal or state levers, or by supporting provider or delivery system change through quality improvement activities and strengthening collaborations with public health partners or other entities.

Alignment of Strategies with Current and Planned Activities

Critical to achieving optimal results is alignment of these strategies with current CMS activities and leveraging state, federal, and other partnerships as they relate to implementation of the identified strategies. This crosswalk provides a summary of the identified strategies in relation to current and planned CMS improvement activities. It also indicates the various leads that are critical to maximizing the impact of the strategies to improve outcomes. The lead indicators are offered only as a guide and provide context for the level at which implementation of policy change and the execution of programs and/or incentives that will impact outcomes may take place.
