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Member eligibility for Transitional Rent will remain consistent with what is provided in Attachment G of the BH-CONNECT Special Terms and Conditions (STCs). In accordance with STC 10.7 and Attachment G, in addition to the Behavioral Health Population of Focus, MCPs may elect to cover Transitional Rent for other Transitional Rent-eligible populations starting on January 1, 2026. Below are the MCPs that have elected to cover additional Transitional Rent-eligible populations in select counties (defined in the subsequent subsection) starting on January 1, 2026 and July 1, 2026.

- Starting on January 1, 2026, SCAN Health Plan in Los Angeles County will cover:
 - Transitioning out of institutional or congregate residential settings population (Attachment G, Section 2(A)(1))
 - Transitioning out of interim housing population (Attachment G, Section 2(A)(3))
 - Transitioning out of recuperative care and short-term post-hospitalization housing population (Attachment G, Section 2(A)(4))
 - Unsheltered homeless population (Attachment G, Section 2(A)(6))
- Starting on July 1, 2026, AIDS Healthcare Foundation in Los Angeles County will cover:
 - Transitioning out of institutional or congregate residential settings population (Attachment G, Section 2(A)(1))
 - Transitioning out of interim housing population (Attachment G, Section 2(A)(3))
 - Transitioning out of recuperative care and short-term post-hospitalization housing population (Attachment G, Section 2(A)(4))
 - Unsheltered homeless population (Attachment G, Section 2(A)(6)

Eligibility Criteria for Additional Transitional Rent Eligible-Populations

- Transitioning out of institutional or congregate residential settings population are those Medi-Cal MCP members who:
 - Satisfy the clinical risk factor requirement, satisfy the social risk factor requirement, and have not reached their 6-month global cap for room and board-only supports, pursuant to Attachment G, Section 2(B)-(D).
 - Are transitioning out of an institutional or congregate residential setting, as described in Attachment G, Section 2(A)(1).
- Transitioning out of interim housing population are those Medi-Cal MCP members who:
 - Satisfy the clinical risk factor requirement, satisfy the social risk factor requirement, and have not reached their 6-month global cap for room and board-only supports, pursuant to Attachment G, Section 2(B)-(D).

- Are transitioning out of interim housing, as described in Attachment G, Section 2(A)(3).
- Transitioning out of recuperative care and short-term post-hospitalization housing population are those Medi-Cal MCP members who
 - Satisfy the clinical risk factor requirement, satisfy the social risk factor requirement, and have not reached their 6-month global cap for room and board-only supports, pursuant to Attachment G, Section 2(B)-(D).
 - Are transitioning out of recuperative care or short-term post-hospitalization housing, as described in Attachment G, Section 2(A)(4).
- Unsheltered homeless population are those Medi-Cal MCP members who:
 - Satisfy the clinical risk factor requirement, satisfy the social risk factor requirement, and have not reached their 6-month global cap for room and board-only supports, pursuant to Attachment G, Section 2(B)-(D).
 - Are unsheltered homeless as described in 24 CFR part 91.5, as detailed in Attachment G, Section 2(A)(6).
