The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) has completed its review of the serious mental illness (SMI) monitoring protocol, which is required by the Special Terms and Conditions (STC) of Indiana's section 1115 demonstration, "Healthy Indiana Plan (HIP)" (Project No. 11-W-00296/5). CMS has determined that the monitoring protocol, which was submitted on December 3, 2020, meets the requirements set forth in the STCs, and thereby approves Indiana's SMI monitoring protocol.

The monitoring protocol is approved for the demonstration period through December 31, 2020 and is hereby incorporated into the demonstration STCs as Attachment H. In accordance with STC 42 (Public Access), the approved SMI monitoring protocol may now be posted to your state's Medicaid website.
