During the reporting period, DY2 Q3, New Hampshire identified the following trends from the data:

The state has seen an increase of greater than 2 percent in measure “Q1 Providers Utilization of the NH Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP)”. The Office of Licensing (OOL) has determined that the increase in searches of the PDMP during the quarter primarily occurred in March of 2020 by users with the system role “Prescriber – Delegate.” This role is typically provided to ancillary staff that are supporting providers (e.g. LNAs). During the quarter OOL saw an increase in accounts that were established for this system role, suggesting that prescribers are delegating this task more regularly to ancillary staff. DHHS will continue to monitor the increase in the coming quarters.

This is the only metric trend that showed a change of 2% over the time of the waiver through 3/31/2020
