NJ HRSN Payment Methodologies and Fee Schedule: Housing Supports

HRSN Services: housing supports. In accordance with the state's Section 1115 Demonstration Special Terms and Conditions (STCs), all rate and/or payment methodologies for authorized HRSN services outlined in the STCs must be submitted to CMS for review and approval prior to implementation, including but not limited to FFS payment as well as non-risk payments and capitation rates in managed care delivery systems, as required by Section 10.14.

The STCs require that NJ must submit all documentation requested by CMS, including but not limited to the payment rate methodology, as well as other documentation and supporting information (e.g., state responses to Medicaid non-federal share financing questions). The state must also comply with the Public Notice Procedures set forth in 42 CFR 447.205 for changes in statewide methods and standards for setting FFS payment rates. NJ will publish public notice of the rates for pre-tenancy and tenancy sustaining services prior to the effective date of those services and will inform CMS of the published notice also prior to the effective date for the services.

Notes:

- 1. Rates for pre-tenancy and tenancy sustaining services may be paid as "per member per 30 days" to simplify implementation and better align with the authorization process.
- 2. Members will be assessed as higher or lower level of need for pre-tenancy and tenancy sustaining services using a state-developed tool. If a member is assessed as higher-level of need, the provider will be required to provide a greater intensity of services (e.g., more touchpoints in a month).
- 3. To develop a rate, NJ referenced salaries and fringe rates established in similar programs already in operation in NJ outside of Medicaid such as Department of Community Affairs Office of Homelessness Prevention (DCA OHP) programs Document Assistance and Supportive Housing (DASH) and Homelessness Prevention and Rapid Rehousing Program (HPRP2). This comparable rate information was combined with expected housing case manager ratios. The rates and ratios are consistent with DCA OHP programs and the findings of a survey of NJ housing services organizations.
- 4. To validate that NJ's cost-based estimate of pre-tenancy and tenancy sustaining rates is appropriate, NJ compared rates to peer state benchmarks including Rhode Island Home Find and Home Stabilization services; North Carolina Health Opportunities Pilot; Washington Foundational Community Supports; Washington D.C. Housing Support Services; Massachusetts Community Support Program and Flexible Services Program; and California Community Supports and Enhanced Care Management.
