Maine believes that the objectives of the RAC program are efficiently achieved through current program integrity efforts. • Maine has repeatedly received a RAC waiver for many years now based on its current PI processes o CMS recently approved an APD for Maine's Program Integrity to implement a much more advanced data analytics platform that will help improve PI's efforts and implementation of that is currently underway. Maine has partnered with a CMS Unified Program Integrity Contractor (UPIC) for several years now Maine's 2024 PERM improper error rates for Medicaid are 2.41% for medical and 0% for eligibility Maine currently has a contract with Health Management Systems (HMS), where they perform audits on the following four provider types: hospitals, nursing facilities (NFs), Private Non-medical Institutions (PNMIs) and Intermediate Care Facilities (ICFs).
