#### Registered Behavior Technician (Section 3.1-A page 10gk)

Technicians are not required to have the Registered Behavior Technician (RBT) credential if they have completed all training but are unable to test due to COVID-19 related Behavior Analyst Certification Board test center closure or COVID-19 related delays. The RBTs would still operate under the supervision of a licensed behavior analyst or licensed psychologist.
