13.C.1 Preventive Services

Community Health Worker Services:

Description of the services and each of the component services:

Community Health Worker (CHW) services is a preventive health service to prevent disease, disability, and other health conditions or their progression; to prolong life; and/or to promote physical and mental health and efficiency.

The following component services are covered when performed by CHWs within the scope of their practice:

- Health Promotion and Coaching for individual beneficiaries or groups of beneficiaries, includes activities to help beneficiaries understand or manage health risks related to a diagnosed condition, setting health goals and creating an action plan, and providing information and/or coaching.
- Health Education and Training for individual beneficiaries or groups of beneficiaries on standardized, evidence-based methods and measures that have been proven effective in preventing disease, disability, and other health conditions or their progression; prolonging life; and/or promoting physical and mental health and efficiency. Health Education and Training services provided by CHWs are covered when the CHW provides the education and/or training using pre-approved training materials.
- Health system navigation and resource coordination services for individual beneficiaries only, including helping to engage, re-engage, or ensure patient-led follow-up in primary care, routine preventive care, adherence to treatment plans, and/or self-management of chronic conditions including by assisting beneficiaries to access covered services and other relevant community resources.

CHW services do not involve diagnosis, clinical care or treatment, or counseling. CHW services must be medically necessary and prescribed or ordered by a licensed practitioner of the healing arts (LPHA) within the scope of their practice under State law. Orders by a LPHA must be reviewed for continued medical necessity and renewed at least every six (6) months.

Service Limitations

CHW services cannot be duplicative of any other Medicaid State Plan or waiver services provided to the beneficiary.

Services provided by a Community Health Worker are limited to two (2) hours in a twenty-four (24) hour period, not to exceed twelve (12) hours per calendar month per recipient without prior authorization. If medically necessary, prior authorization can be requested for additional services.

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Provider Qualifications:

All newly enrolled CHWs must be certified by the Rhode Island Certification Board; Effective October 1, 2025, all currently enrolled CHWs must be certified by the Rhode Island Certification Board.

Certification by the Rhode Island Certification Board includes the following requirements:

- Completion of six months or 1,000 hours of paid or volunteer work experience within the last five vears:
- Completion of 50 hours of supervised work;
- Completion of 70 hours of education; and
- Submission of a portfolio, which is a collection of personal and professional activities and achievements.

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Community Health Worker Services Payment:

Payment methodology:

Service time billed must be for direct contact with a beneficiary, as medically necessary and as prescribed by a physician or licensed practitioner of the healing arts within their scope of authorized practice under State Law.

CHWs may not bill for time spent on travel, outreach, documentation, or activities not directly delivered to the beneficiary.

The bases of payment are:

- 1. 30-minute units of service for individuals or groups up to eight (8) people for Health Promotion and Coaching and Health Education and Training
- 2. 15-minute units of service for individuals for Health System Navigation and Resource Coordination

Rates and Rate Increases:

Except as otherwise noted in the plan, state developed fee schedule rates are the same for both governmental and private providers reimbursement. The agency's fee schedule rate was set as of <u>May 19, 2025</u>, and is effective for services provided on or after that date.
