

January 2025: Medicaid and CHIP Eligibility Operations and Enrollment Snapshot



Eligibility Operations and Enrollment Snapshot

- To promote transparency and provide insights into states' Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) eligibility operations and enrollment, this Snapshot captures state reporting of Performance Indicator Data, Eligibility Processing Data, and Transformed Medicaid Statistical Information System (T-MSIS) data focusing on:
 - Medicaid and CHIP enrollment;
 - Total applications submitted to Medicaid, CHIP, Human Services agencies, and State-based Marketplaces;
 - Modified adjusted gross income (MAGI) application processing times;
 - Renewal outcomes; and
 - Call center metrics.
- CMS releases this Snapshot on a monthly-basis, providing current month and retrospective data to convey a
 national and state-specific picture of Medicaid and CHIP eligibility and enrollment operations, as well as
 Marketplace and Basic Health Program (BHP) enrollment. CMS releases additional data on a quarterly-basis,
 including data on separate CHIP program enrollment and updated renewal outcomes. The Snapshot with this
 additional data will be released on the last month of the quarter.
- Enrollment trends in this Snapshot are compared with February 2020 data to reflect the impacts of the Medicaid continuous enrollment condition. The continuous enrollment condition authorized by the Families First Coronavirus Response Act ended on March 31, 2023, with states resuming routine eligibility renewals, including terminations of coverage for individuals who are no longer eligible beginning on April 1, 2023.

What You Should Know When Using the Data: Performance Indicator Data Set

The Medicaid and CHIP Eligibility and Enrollment Performance Indicator Data Set (Performance Indicator Data) includes preliminary monthly aggregate data on states' eligibility and enrollment processes.

- States submit these data to CMS monthly.
- Definitions of elements in the Performance Indicator Data vary from other data sets, including T-MSIS and Medicaid and CHIP Eligibility Processing Data Report, and comparisons should not be made across data sets.
- Medicaid and CHIP enrollment counts include individuals receiving comprehensive Medicaid and CHIP benefits and represent a point-in-time count on the last day of the calendar month. CHIP enrollment includes all individuals with CHIP-funded coverage, including children enrolled in Medicaid-expansion CHIP, children enrolled in a separate CHIP, and pregnant adult women enrolled in a separate CHIP.
- MAGI application processing time data represent the length of time it takes state Medicaid and CHIP agencies to conduct all
 final MAGI determinations (including Medicaid MAGI and CHIP) for individuals at application, regardless of date of application.
 - Application processing time data are influenced by state policies, practices including verification processes, and other factors including application volume, staffing, and level of automation in a state's eligibility system.
 - States may prioritize processing older applications. As these are completed, the data would reflect longer processing times, with the volume and age of pending applications decreasing.
 - o Processing time data exclude renewals and redeterminations, and the data do not reflect the state's volume of pending applications.
- CMS released **state call center data** for the first time in July 2023. There is wide variation in how states operate their call centers, making it difficult to compare these data.

What You Should Know When Using the Data: Eligibility Processing Data Report

The Medicaid and CHIP Eligibility Processing Data Report (Eligibility Processing Data) includes monthly aggregate data on states' renewal processes and outcomes.

- Medicaid and CHIP renewal outcomes are reported by cohort. States report outcomes for all individuals in the month
 in which renewals for the cohort are due, even if some renewals were completed in a prior month. These data represent
 the outcome of renewals due in the reporting month (generally effective the first of the following month).
- State-reported data may reflect routine renewal data, or a combination of unwinding-related renewal data and routine renewal data.
- Multiple factors, including state-adopted mitigations and other strategies, may influence renewal outcomes and reporting in a state.¹ For example:
 - States with an ex parte mitigation strategy that use data sources to complete a renewal after a form is sent may report those renewals as completed based on the return of a renewal form and underreport the number of individuals renewed on an ex parte basis.
 - Some states are temporarily holding some or all procedural terminations as a mitigation strategy to ensure compliance with federal renewal requirements or have voluntarily implemented a strategy to delay procedural terminations to conduct additional outreach. These states may report zero procedural terminations and/or a significantly higher share of pending renewals at the end of a reporting month.

Please consider these factors and other information when interpreting renewal outcomes and comparing information across states.

What You Should Know When Using the Data: Updated Eligibility Processing Data Report

States submit updated monthly renewal outcomes data after the original monthly report submission. This **Updated Medicaid and CHIP Eligibility Processing Data** (**Updated Eligibility Processing Data**), made available on a quarterly-basis in this Snapshot, includes aggregate data on states' renewal processes and outcomes for renewals previously reported in prior months as pending as of three months after the renewal was due.

- "Pending" renewals are renewals that are due in a reporting month but that a state has not completed processing by the renewal due date.
- Renewals may be pending by the end of the month they are due for a number of reasons including, but not limited to:
 - o Beneficiaries returning renewal forms late in the renewal process, leaving little time for the state to complete processing;
 - States holding procedural terminations and/or other terminations (e.g., by adopting CMS-approved strategies to delay procedural disenrollments for one month while conducting outreach); or
 - o States being unable to process all renewals received before the end of the month in which they are due.
- The Updated Eligibility Processing Data may also reflect states' corrections to previously reported data.

What You Should Know When Using the Data: Marketplace and Basic Health Plan Enrollment / Other Data

Marketplace Enrollment Data (Marketplace Data)

- Marketplace enrollment data are from HealthCare.gov Marketplace Operational Data and State-based Marketplace Operational Data.
- Marketplace enrollment represents enrollees who have effectuated their plan selection (i.e., paid their first month's premium, if any). The data are revised every month to reflect new effectuations, as well as retroactive enrollments, cancellations, and terminations, and other data corrections.

Basic Health Program Enrollment / Other Data (BHP Data)

- BHP enrollment includes data reported to CMS by three states: Minnesota (MN), New York (NY), and Oregon (OR).
 - MN and OR operate a BHP, which provides coverage to consumers with incomes at or below 200 percent of the FPL who are not eligible for Medicaid or CHIP and otherwise would be eligible for a QHP. OR implemented its BHP and started reporting BHP enrollment data beginning in July 2024.
 - Effective April 2024, NY transitioned from operating a BHP to a new coverage program, the Essential Plan Expansion (EP), that generally mirrors the state's BHP and is implemented under its approved section 1332 waiver. The EP expands eligibility to certain individuals with estimated household incomes up to 250 percent FPL, including some who would otherwise be enrolled in Medicaid coverage or in a state-funded health insurance program absent the waiver. Even though NY's EP is not a BHP, enrollment in this new coverage program continues to be reported in the BHP enrollment data.

What You Should Know When Using the Data: T-MSIS Analytic Files Separate CHIP Enrollment Data

Separate CHIP Enrollment Data (S-CHIP Data), made available on a quarterly-basis in this Snapshot, include monthly data on children and pregnant adult women enrolled in states' separate CHIP programs at any point during the reporting month.

- The S-CHIP Data come from the T-MSIS Analytic Files (TAF).
 - States report the latest information available from state systems in their monthly T-MSIS submissions, including individual-level data about enrollees' Medicaid or CHIP eligibility status.
 - The T-MSIS data are converted into the TAF, which are optimized for monitoring and research purposes.
 - States with T-MSIS data quality or submission issues have the option to provide S-CHIP enrollment counts outside of T-MSIS.
- The S-CHIP Data do not include:
 - Enrollees covered by Medicaid-expansion CHIP. If an individual is enrolled in both Medicaid or Medicaid-expansion
 CHIP and S-CHIP in a given month, TAF picks the program in which they were last enrolled.
 - o Enrollees in dental-only S-CHIP coverage.
- Enrollment definitions in the Performance Indicator Data vary from the TAF's and comparisons should not be made across
 data sets.

January 2025 Key Findings

Medicaid and CHIP Enrollment

- In January 2025, **78.8 million** individuals were enrolled in Medicaid and CHIP.
 - o **71.4 million** individuals were enrolled in Medicaid, and **7.3 million** individuals were enrolled in CHIP.
 - 41.4 million adults were enrolled in Medicaid, and there were 37.4 million Medicaid child and CHIP enrollees.

Medicaid and CHIP Applications Received

- In January 2025, Medicaid, CHIP, Human Services agencies, and State-based Marketplaces received **3.0 million** applications, or **less than 1 percent** more applications, as compared to December 2024.
 - The number of applications received has increased by 16 percent since January 2024 and increased by 77 percent since January 2023.

January 2025 Key Findings (Continued)

MAGI Application Processing Time

In January 2025, 66 percent of MAGI applications were processed in 7 days or less, and 6 percent of MAGI applications
were processed in over 45 days, the regulatory standard for determining eligibility on a basis other than disability,
including MAGI-based determinations.

Renewal Outcomes

- In January 2025, of the individuals due for renewal:
 - o **72 percent** had their coverage renewed, a two percentage point decrease from December 2024.
 - **54 percent** were renewed on an *ex parte* basis, a three percentage point decrease from December 2024.
 - 16 percent were disenrolled, a one percentage point decrease from December 2024.
 - 10 percent were disenrolled for procedural reasons, a one percentage point decrease from December 2024.



January 2025: Total Medicaid and CHIP Enrollment

Monthly Medicaid and CHIP Enrollment, January 2025

- In January 2025, total Medicaid and CHIP enrollment was 78.8 million individuals nationally, a decrease of 100,000 individuals (0.1 percent) from December 2024.
 - Medicaid enrollment was 71.4 million individuals.
 - CHIP enrollment was 7.3 million individuals.

Percent Change in Medicaid and CHIP Enrollment, December 2024 to January 2025



Not Reported

January 2024 to January 2025: Total Monthly Medicaid and CHIP Enrollment

- Between January 2024 and January 2025, Medicaid enrollment decreased by **5.6 million** individuals (7 percent) and CHIP enrollment increased by **110,000** individuals (1 percent).
- Between February 2020 (the pre-pandemic baseline) and January 2025, Medicaid enrollment increased by **7.3** million individuals (11 percent) and CHIP enrollment increased by **440,000** individuals (6 percent).



January 2024 to January 2025: Total Monthly Medicaid Child and CHIP Enrollment and Medicaid Adult Enrollment

- In January 2025, Medicaid child and CHIP enrollment was 37.4 million individuals and Medicaid adult enrollment was 41.4 million individuals.
- Between January 2024 and January 2025, Medicaid child and CHIP enrollment decreased by 700,000 individuals (2 percent) and Medicaid adult enrollment decreased by 2.9 million individuals (7 percent).
- Between February 2020 (pre-pandemic baseline) and January 2025, Medicaid child and CHIP enrollment increased by 2.2 million individuals (6 percent) and Medicaid adult enrollment increased by 7.1 million individuals (21 percent).





January 2025: Total Enrollment in Medicaid and CHIP, BHP/Other, and the Marketplace


- In January 2025, 102.8 million individuals were enrolled in Medicaid and CHIP, a BHP/Other, or the Marketplace.
 - Medicaid and CHIP enrollment was approximately 78.8 million individuals.
 - Marketplace enrollment was approximately
 22.3 million individuals.
 - BHP enrollment was approximately 1.8 million individuals.
- Since March 2023, total enrollment across Medicaid, CHIP, BHP, and the Marketplace has declined by 7.9 million individuals (7 percent). This is a 15.4 million individual decrease for Medicaid and CHIP and a 7.0 million individual increase for the Marketplace.

January 2023 to January 2025: Applications for Medicaid and CHIP Received by States


• In January 2025, **3.0 million** applications for Medicaid or CHIP were received by states, which is **16 percent** more applications than were received in January 2024.



Marketplace Open Enrollment period


January 2025: Percentage of MAGI Applications States Processed in 7 Days or Less

• In January 2025, nationally, **66 percent** of MAGI determinations at application were processed in 7 days or less. **16 states** were at or above this national percentage.




January 2025: Percentage of MAGI Applications States Processed in Over 45 Days

• In January 2025, nationally, **6 percent** of MAGI determinations at application were processed in over 45 days, the regulatory standard for determining eligibility on a basis other than disability, including MAGI-based determinations. **23 states** were at or above this national percentage.



January 2025: Distribution of Renewal Outcomes

• In January 2025, of the **6.0 million individuals** due for renewal, **72 percent** had their coverage successfully renewed, **16 percent** were disenrolled, and **12 percent** had their renewals pending at the end of the month.





January 2024 to January 2025: National Retention Rates at Renewal, by Renewal Type

- In January 2025, of the individuals due for renewal, **54 percent** were renewed on an *ex parte* basis and **18 percent** were renewed based on a form.
- Since June 2024, retention rates at renewal exceeded **70 percent** each month.



January 2024 to January 2025: National Disenrollment Rates at Renewal, by Disenrollment Type

- In January 2025, of the individuals due for renewal, **10 percent** were disenrolled for procedural reasons and **6 percent** were disenrolled based on a form.
- Since March 2024, procedural disenrollment rates have been less than 13 percent.






January 2025: States' Coverage Retention Rates at Renewal, by Renewal Type

• In January 2025, states' coverage retention rates at renewal ranged from **24 to 94 percent** and *ex parte* rates ranged from **9 to 86 percent**.



January 2025: States' Coverage Disenrollment Rates at Renewal, by Disenrollment Type

• In January 2025, states' rates of disenrollment at renewal ranged from 3 to 44 percent and procedural disenrollment rates ranged from 0 to 37 percent.
