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Individuals Eligible for but Not Receiving Cash Assistance

BACKGROUND

Overview

This reviewable unit (RU) describes the optional Medicaid eligibility group for individuals who meet the requirements for a cash assistance program, but who are not receiving a cash benefit. It provides the criteria under which individuals may be covered under this group, as well as the income and resource standards used.

In most states receipt of supplemental security income (SSI) or an optional state supplement guarantees eligibility for Medicaid. However, there are some individuals who meet the income and resource requirements for cash assistance but who do not want to apply for those benefits or who, for other reasons, do not actually receive a cash benefit (and are not considered, or "deemed," to be receiving cash assistance). By adopting the Individuals Eligible for but Not Receiving Cash Assistance eligibility group, states can extend Medicaid eligibility to these individuals. In addition, because a state may utilize less restrictive income and/or resource methodologies for this group, states can also extend eligibility to individuals who would qualify for cash assistance, but for income and/or resources exceeding the standards for these programs.

Characteristics

The Individuals Eligible for but Not Receiving Cash Assistance group is an optional eligibility group described in section 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii)(I) of the Social Security Act (the Act). This eligibility group covers individuals who meet the eligibility requirements of one or more cash assistance programs but do not actually receive cash assistance.

Options: Cash Assistance Programs. In adopting the Individuals Eligible for but Not Receiving Cash Assistance eligibility group, states have the flexibility to utilize the eligibility requirements of one or more cash assistance programs serving individuals who are age 65 or older, or who have blindness or a disability. States may utilize the eligibility requirements of the SSI program, the eligibility requirements for their optional state supplement, or both. Territories may elect to use any of their territory-specific cash assistance programs, including aid to the aged, blind, and disabled (AABD); aid to the blind (AB); aid to the permanently and totally disabled (APTD); or old age assistance (OAA).

States may also choose to extend eligibility under this group to individuals who meet the requirements of the former Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC) program. When this option is selected, states will utilize the AFDC requirements in effect in the state as of July 16, 1996. Use of this option will be rare because individuals who would meet the requirements

of the former AFDC program will generally be eligible under another eligibility group such as the Infants and Children under Age 19 group. CMS will provide additional assistance to states considering this option.

Individuals Covered

When covering the Individuals Eligible for but Not Receiving Cash Assistance group, states may choose to extend eligibility to all individuals who meet the characteristics of this group, or a state may limit eligibility to specific populations of individuals.

Section 1902(a)(10)(A)(ii) of the Act and 42 C.F.R. Part 435 (Part 436 in the territories), Subpart C describe most optional Medicaid eligibility groups, while section 1905(a) of the Act and 42 C.F.R. §435.201 (§436.201 in the territories) describe the specific populations that may be covered in an optional eligibility group. Together, these provisions allow states to target an optional eligibility group to a specific population.

In choosing to cover all individuals who meet the requirements for SSI or an optional state supplement, states are electing to cover the populations described at 42 C.F.R. §§435.201(a)(1), (a)(2), and (a)(3). Alternatively, states may elect to cover other specified populations of individuals. For example, a state could limit coverage in this group to the population of individuals who are age 65 or older and the population of individuals under age 21 (described at 42 C.F.R. §435.201(a)(4)). In this example, an individual under age 21 must have blindness or a disability in order to meet the requirements for SSI or an optional state supplement.

Financial Methodologies

The methodologies used to determine eligibility for the Individuals Eligible for but Not Receiving Cash Assistance group may vary depending on the cash assistance program(s) selected. When determining eligibility for an individual on the basis of age (65 or older), blindness, or disability, states must use SSI financial methodologies, and territories must use the financial methodologies of the most closely related cash assistance program. 209(b) states may apply their more restrictive income and resource counting requirements when determining eligibility for this group.

For individuals who are seeking eligibility on the basis of meeting AFDC requirements, the state/territory may elect to use either AFDC methodologies or MAGI-like methodologies.

Options: Less Restrictive Methodologies. States may apply less restrictive income and resource methodologies under section 1902(r)(2) of the Act. Additional information on less restrictive income and resource counting methodologies can be found in the implementation guides that accompany the Less Restrictive Income Methodologies under 1902(r)(2) screen and the Less Restrictive Resource Methodologies under 1902(r)(2) screen.

REVIEWABLE UNIT DEPENDENCIES

Many RUs in MACPro are dependent upon other RUs. Each time a primary RU is changed, there could be an effect on other, secondary RUs which are dependent on the primary. For example, in the **Mandatory Eligibility Groups** RU, there is a question as to whether the state covers the Adult Group. If **Yes** is selected, and if a box is checked to include the Adult Group in the submission package, then the **Adult Group** RU will be included by the system in the package and the user can navigate to it to complete it. If **No** is selected, the **Adult Group** RU will not be included in the package. In this example, the **Mandatory Eligibility Groups** RU is the **Primary RU** and the **Adult Group** RU is the **Secondary RU**. The **Adult Group** RU is considered to be dependent on selections made in the **Mandatory Eligibility Groups** RU.

Whenever a change in a primary RU may affect a secondary RU, you either need to revise the secondary RU (if it is already in the package) or add the secondary RU to the package so that it can be updated in the same submission package as the primary RU.

INSTRUCTIONS

Where there are unique instructions for a 1634, SSI Criteria, or 209(b) state, or for a territory, the reader will be directed to the appropriate instructions.

A. Characteristics

For States

- At **A.1.**, select one or more of the three options (**A.1.a.** through **A.1.c.**) to indicate the cash assistance program eligibility requirements that individuals would meet in order to qualify under this group.
- At **A.2.** there is a statement that individuals do not receive cash assistance under the programs selected in **A.1.**

For Territories

- At **A.1.**, select one or more of the five options (**A.1.a.** through **A.1.e.**) to indicate the program(s) eligibility requirements used for this group.
- At **A.2.** there is a statement that individuals do not receive cash assistance under the programs selected in **A.1.**

B. Individuals Covered

- At **B.1.**, select **Yes** or **No** to indicate if the state covers all individuals who meet the characteristics described in section **A.**
 - o If *No* is selected at **B.1.**, choose one or more of the eight options (**B.2.a.** through **B.2.h.**) to indicate the populations covered in this group.
 - If **B.2.d.** *All children under a specified age limit* is selected, choose one of the four options (**B.2.d.i.** through **B.2.d.iv.**) to indicate the specified age of all children covered.
 - If **B.2.e.** Reasonable classifications of children is selected, choose the Add Classification button. See the Reasonable Classifications of Children Under Age 21, 20, 19 or 18 implementation guide for the instructions on how to complete the screen.
 - When you have completed this screen, select the *Save Classifications* button to return to the **Individuals Eligible for but Not Receiving Cash Assistance** RU. The classifications selected will appear in the RU.
 - If you wish to make a change, select the *Edit Classifications* button
 - If **B.2.h.** *Other population* is selected:
 - Provide the name of the population and a description in the text boxes provided.
 - *Screen Validation*: Each name entered here must be different from the other names.
 - If there is more than one other population, select the +Add
 Population link and repeat the above step.
 - To delete a previously added population, select *Delete* next to its name and description.

For 1634 States and SSI Criteria States

For 209(b) States

- If either SSI or Optional State Supplement were selected in section **A**, at **C.1.**, select one of the two options (**C.1.a.** or **C.1.b.**) to indicate if SSI methodologies are used in calculating household income and resources for individuals who are seeking eligibility on the basis of being 65 years old or older or having blindness or a disability, or if more restrictive requirements than SSI apply to this group.
 - o If **C.1.a.** *SSI methodologies* is selected, there is a statement that the Non-MAGI methodologies are described in the **Non-MAGI Methodologies** RU.

If you wish to view the approved methodologies, select the *View approved version of Non-MAGI Methodologies* link.

- The **Non-MAGI Methodologies** RU will appear if there is an approved version in the MACPro system.
- If there is no approved version of the RU in MACPro, a screen will appear with the following message: "There is no approved version of this reviewable unit in MACPro available to display."
- Select the *Individuals Eligible for but Not Receiving Cash Assistance* link to return to the **Individuals Eligible for but Not Receiving Cash Assistance** RU.
