# Medicaid and CHIP National Summary of Renewal Outcomes – September 2023 and National Summary to Date

December 2023



## **National Summary of Renewal Outcomes**

- This National Summary of Renewal Outcomes provides an overview of Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) data on states' progress resuming their regular processes for renewing individuals' coverage after the end of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) Medicaid continuous enrollment condition.
- States must submit specific metrics about Medicaid and CHIP renewals initiated and completed for a cohort in a given month using the "Unwinding Eligibility and Enrollment Data Reporting Template" (Unwinding Data Report).
- The data in this summary include metrics required by the Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2023 (CAA, 2023), as well as other state-reported data and calculations that provide additional context to understand renewal outcomes.

### Context and Data Notes: Understanding Renewal Timelines & Reporting

- Medicaid and CHIP renewal outcomes are reported by cohort. States report outcomes for all individuals in the month in which renewals for the cohort are due, even if some renewals were completed in a prior month.
- States began unwinding in February, March, or April 2023 by initiating their first cohort of renewals.
- The length of states' renewal process varies. Most states take between 45 and 90 days to complete renewals for a cohort. As a result, states are completing renewals on different schedules and will report outcomes in different months.
- As of September 30<sup>th</sup>, 2023, all states and the District of Columbia had completed at least one full cohort of unwinding-related renewals.
- States have flexibility in how to distribute Medicaid and CHIP renewals during the unwinding period, and nearly half of states (22) elected to prioritize renewals for some or all individuals identified by the state as likely ineligible for Medicaid and/or CHIP.

## **Context and Data Notes: Interpreting Renewal Outcomes**

- Multiple factors, including state-adopted mitigations and other strategies, may influence renewal outcomes and reporting in a state. For example:
  - States with an *ex parte* mitigation strategy that use data sources to complete a renewal after a form is sent may report those renewals as completed based on the return of a renewal form and underreport the number of individuals renewed on an *ex parte* basis.
  - Some states are temporarily holding some or all procedural terminations as a mitigation strategy to ensure compliance with federal renewal requirements or have voluntarily implemented a strategy to delay procedural terminations to conduct additional outreach. These states may report zero procedural terminations and/or a significantly higher share of pending renewals at the end of a reporting month.
  - Some states have restored eligibility for people initially found ineligible due to systems or other errors. This is frequently not identifiable in the data.
- Please consider these factors, states' distribution and prioritization of renewals, and other information when interpreting renewal outcomes and comparing information across states. Data limitations in the <u>Medicaid and CHIP CAA Reporting</u> <u>Metrics</u> provide additional state-specific information.

## **Context and Data Notes: Holding Procedural Terminations**

- Among states that had a cohort of unwinding-related renewals due in the following month(s), these states paused some
  or all procedural terminations:
  - March cohort: Idaho
  - April cohort: Idaho, Oklahoma, and Wyoming
  - May cohort: Delaware, Kansas, Kentucky, Maine, West Virginia, and Wyoming
  - June cohort: Arkansas, District of Columbia, Delaware, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Maine, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, New Jersey, New York, Oklahoma, South Carolina, West Virginia, and Wyoming
  - July cohort: Arkansas, District of Columbia, Delaware, Illinois, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Maine, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, New Jersey, New York, Oklahoma, South Carolina, West Virginia, and Wyoming
  - August cohort: District of Columbia, Delaware, Illinois, Kansas, Kentucky, Maryland, Maine, Michigan, New Jersey, New York, South Carolina, and Virginia
  - September cohort: Alaska, Colorado, District of Columbia, Delaware, Hawaii, Idaho, Illinois, Kansas, Kentucky,
    Maryland, Maine, Michigan, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New Mexico, Nevada, New York, Oregon, South Carolina,
    Virginia, Vermont, and West Virginia
- States report renewal outcomes by cohort in the month the renewal is due. In most states, the effective date for procedural terminations is the beginning of the following month in which the renewal was due (e.g., procedural terminations for renewals due and reported in the month of March would have an effective termination date of April 1).

#### Notes:

- These data represent the outcomes of renewals due from March-September 2023 in all 50 states plus DC. Total renewals initiated to-date represents data from February-September 2023. Except for renewals initiated, data for MA from May-July 2023 are excluded due to reporting issues. Numbers and percentages may not sum due to rounding.
- Pending renewals to date reflect the sum of total pending renewals at the end of each reporting month and not the cumulative total of pending renewals as of the end of September. States may complete renewals pending in the month after the reporting month. Some states may have reinstated coverage for individuals who were terminated from Medicaid or CHIP in subsequent months. Those reinstatements are not reflected in the data.



## Medicaid and CHIP Renewal Outcomes Key Takeaways, March-September 2023

- With 7 months of renewal outcomes data, 34.5 million beneficiaries had a renewal due.
   Of renewals due:
  - 17.4 million beneficiaries (50% of total due) had their Medicaid or CHIP coverage renewed.
  - 9.2 million beneficiaries (27% of total due) had their Medicaid or CHIP coverage terminated.
  - 8.0 million beneficiaries (23% of total due) had renewals that remained pending.
- Since June 2023, coverage for more than 50% of beneficiaries due for renewal was successfully renewed each month.

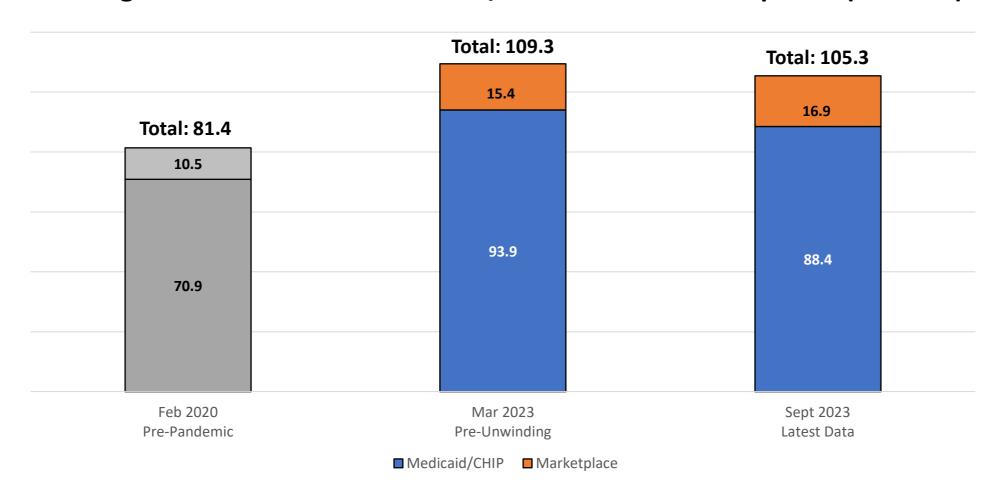

## **Enrollment in Medicaid/CHIP and Marketplace Coverage**

#### Changes in Enrollment in Medicaid/CHIP and the Marketplaces (Millions)



- As of September 2023, Medicaid and CHIP enrollment is about 88.4 million and as of October 15, 2023, Marketplace enrollment is about 16.9 million.
- Enrollment across these programs (Medicaid, CHIP, and the Marketplaces) has declined by nearly 4 million (or about 4%) since March 2023 (a decrease by about 5.5 million for Medicaid and CHIP and an increase by over 1.5 million for the Marketplaces).

- Total Medicaid and CHIP enrollment declined by approximately 5.4 million people between March and September 2023.
- There were 7.5 million people disenrolled from Medicaid and CHIP during the same relevant period, from March to August 2023,\* indicating that some individuals may be re-enrolling or newly enrolling in Medicaid or CHIP coverage.

- \*Medicaid and CHIP disenrollments are effectuated in the subsequent month as are reported (e.g., August disenrollments are effectuated in September)
- Enrollment and disenrollment data is a combination of Medicaid and CHIP enrollment and does not include Basic Health Program (BHP) enrollment

- Total Marketplace enrollment increased by more than 1.5 million people from March to September 2023.
- This includes enrollment for **HealthCare.gov and State-Based Marketplaces.**
- While we know that this total increase in Marketplace enrollment is not solely due to individuals leaving Medicaid and CHIP, monthly unwinding public reporting (available on data.Medicaid.gov) on coverage transitions to the Marketplace is lagged and likely an undercount of transitions due to the nature of matching administrative data sets across programs.
