1 Due to reporting system updates, CHIP enrollment totals for FY 2015 and FY 2016 are estimates as a result of the exclusion of certain unborn CHIP enrollees in reporting.

2 Due to eligibility and enrollment system challenges, some CHIP enrollees were assigned to Title XIX Medicaid through quarter 2 of FY 2015. Therefore the CHIP enrollment totals are artificially low in FY 2015.

3 Title XXI funded Medicaid enrollees are included in Medicaid enrollment counts, rather than in CHIP for FY 2015 and FY 2016. Therefore, the CHIP enrollment totals are artificially low and the Medicaid enrollment totals are artificially high for both fiscal years.

4 Due to reporting system challenges, FY 2015 enrollment totals are the most recent annual data available.

5 Due to eligibility and enrollment system challenges, Title XXI funded Medicaid enrollees are included in Medicaid enrollment counts rather than in CHIP for FY 2015.

6 Due to eligibility and enrollment system and data limitations, certain CHIP enrollees were assigned to Title XIX Medicaid. Therefore, the CHIP enrollment totals are artificially low in FY 2016.

7 In FY 2015, children who transitioned between CHIP and Medicaid are reported in both programs, rather than the program in which they were last enrolled. Therefore, the overall FY 2015 enrollment totals are artificially high. Additionally, certain Title XXI funded Medicaid enrollees are included in Medicaid enrollment counts, rather than in CHIP for FY 2015. Therefore, the FY 2015 Medicaid enrollment totals are artificially high.
