Summary Description Including The Department of Health Care Policy and Financing (Department) intends to submit a State Plan Amendment to the Goals and Objectives Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) for updates to Medicaid coverage requirements for the Former Foster Care eligibility category to members who were in foster care and who turned the age of 18 on or after January 1, 2023, were on Medicaid, and who have become residents of Colorado from another state, effective January 1, 2023. The update brings Colorado into compliance with the Federal requirements laid out in Section 1002(a) of the Substance Use-Disorder Prevention That Promotes Opioid Recovery and Treatment for Patients and Communities Act of 2018 (SUPPORT Act). This update impacts members of Former Foster Care by allowing coverage to those who were in foster care at the age of 18 on or after January 1, 2023, who were on Medicaid in another state, and who have become residents of Colorado.
