

Medicaid Continuous Enrollment Condition Unwinding: At-A-Glance

Medicaid and the Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) provided essential health coverage to millions of people during the COVID-19 pandemic. States are now resuming their regular processes for renewing individuals' Medicaid coverage.

BEFORE THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC people frequently transitioned between different types of coverage. Some lost coverage because they were no longer eligible; others due to administrative reasons, such as not returning required paperwork on time. As states resume regular renewal processes now, the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) aims to ensure that all eligible people can keep their coverage or find another source of coverage.

Historical Trends in Medicaid and CHIP Enrollment



As of February 2020 around **71 million** people were enrolled in Medicaid and CHIP

Approximately 17 million people lose Medicaid or CHIP coverage each year. Many find coverage through the Marketplace, Medicare, or their employer. Some also return to Medicaid or CHIP.

As of March 2023 more than **93 million** people were enrolled in Medicaid and CHIP.


Medicaid and CHIP Renewals Due in April 2023
