We have reviewed the proposed State Plan Amendment (SPA) submitted under transmittal number (TN) 13-050-MM. With this SPA, the State affirms citizenship regulations, specifies reasonable opportunity options, and specifies policy options related to immigrant eligibility in accordance to the Affordable Care Act.

Please be informed that this State Plan Amendment was approved on today with an effective date January 1, 2014. We are enclosing the summary page (formerly CMS 179) and the amended plan page(s).

We note that the State's response to the Request for Additional Information (RAI), dated May 7, 2014, outlines the final corrective action plan to address the State's compliance with 1137(d) of the Social Security Act that requires the state furnish benefits to individuals who are otherwise eligible pending verification of citizenship or satisfactory immigration status. According to the May 7, 2014 response, the State has implemented phase 1 and 2 of their corrective action plan and is currently furnishing benefits to individuals pending verification of satisfactory immigration status during a 90 day reasonable opportunity period. We do not require any further action on the part of the State in relation to the approval of this state plan amendment. However, as outlined in phase three of the final corrective action plan, the State will build system interfaces for Steps 2 and 3 of the SAVE system in order to verify satisfactory immigration status. The state has committed to integrating the Steps 2 and 3 of SAVE into their eligibility system and to modifying their verification process to send requests to individuals for paper documentation of satisfactory immigration status only after the electronic process has been exhausted as required under rules, no later than September 2015. As discussed, the State will need to submit a Hub Waiver and update their APD process mitigation plan to continue to track and implement the remainder of the corrective action plan.

From January 1, 2014 through August 31, 2014 the state is using an interim process as documented in the Colorado Non-Citizen Reasonable Opportunity Period Interim Process and Work Plan dated 02-14-2014 to ensure that an individual pending verification of satisfactory immigration status is provided a 90 calendar day reasonable opportunity period to provide documentation. Such individuals will be enrolled in Medicaid and provided access to benefits during the reasonable opportunity period. Beginning September 2014 the state's eligibility and enrollment system modifications will allow client declaration of satisfactory legal status, enrollment into Medicaid, and a reasonable opportunity period of 90 days to provide documentation to verify the self-declared status.
