^a For some measures, the measurement period for the numerator, denominator, or continuous enrollment period varies depending on a specified date for each enrollee (such as enrollee birthdates, prescription or treatment start dates, and discharge dates). For these measures, two ranges are shown. The first date range identifies the full range of possible dates that states will need to use to calculate the measure for all measure-eligible enrollees. The text in parentheses describes the measurement period that should be used for each eligible enrollee.

^b When reporting each measure to CMS in MACPro, states should report the measurement period they used for the denominator in the “Start Date” and “End Date” fields. For many measures, this date range corresponds to calendar year 2012 (January 1, 2012 – December 31, 2012). Some measures also require states to review utilization or enrollment prior to this period to identify the measure eligible population. For these measures, two date ranges are included in this table. The first date range should be used to populate the Start Date and End Date fields in MACPro, while the second date range defines these prior review periods and should not be included in the Start Date and End Date fields in MACPro. For example, the IET-HH measure instructs states to identify enrollees with index episode start dates (IESD) that started January 1, 2012 through November 15, 2012 (the first date range). However, states will also need to review an

enrollee's diagnosis history for 60 days prior to the date of the IESD when the patient had no claims/encounters with a diagnosis of AOD dependence (the second date range). States that followed the FFY 2013 Health Home Core Set specifications should enter "January 1, 2012" in the Start Date field and "November 15, 2012" in the End Date field in MACPro. States should note any deviations to any measurement period (numerator, denominator, continuous enrollment) in the "Deviations from Measurement Specifications" section in MACPro.

^c No more than one gap in enrollment of up to 45 days during each year of the continuous enrollment period. For the FFY 2013 reporting cycle, states may choose to report a rate using a two-year period (as specified) or a one-year period. States may use the one-year period if an adequate sample size cannot be achieved using the two-year continuous enrollment criteria. If a one-year period is used then the measurement period should be January 1, 2012 – December 31, 2012.

^d Blood pressure reading must occur after the diagnosis of hypertension was made.

^e No more than one gap in enrollment of up to 45 days during the continuous enrollment period.

^f No more than one gap in enrollment of up to 45 days during the 365 days prior to the index discharge date and no gap during the 30 days following the index discharge date.
