Chronic Conditions Model

Start Date: 1/1/13

Targeted Conditions: Mental health conditions (non-SMI); substance use disorder (SUD); asthma; diabetes; heart disease; body mass index (BMI) over 25; tobacco use; chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD); hypertension; hyperlipidemia; developmental disabilities or autism spectrum disorders; acquired brain injury; seizure disorders; and cardiac and circulatory congenital abnormalities

Eligibility: Must have (1) two or more chronic conditions, or (2) one chronic condition and at risk for another

Key Providers: Community Care Teams partner with primary care health home practices to manage the care of eligible individuals

Enrollment: Opt-out enrollment

Geography: Statewide

Payment: Per member per month (PMPM)

SMI/SED Model

Start Date: 4/1/14

Targeted Conditions: SMI/SED

Eligibility: Must have one or more SMI (adults) or SED (children)

Key Providers: Team of health care professionals, including enhanced primary care practices (EPCPs) and behavioral health home organizations (BHHOs)

Enrollment: Opt-in enrollment

Geography: Statewide

Payment: PMPM; care management fee tiered based on distinct activities provided

ODU Model

Start Date: 10/1/17

Targeted Conditions: OUD; mental health conditions; SUD; tobacco use; diabetes; heart disease; BMI greater than 25; COPD; hypertension; hyperlipidemia; developmental and intellectual disorders; circulatory congenital abnormalities; asthma; acquired brain injury; and seizure disorders.

Eligibility: Must have OUD and one other chronic condition; OUD and at risk for developing another chronic condition.

Key Providers: Multidisciplinary team of providers, including a clinical team lead, medication-assisted treatment (MAT) prescriber, nurse care manager, opioid dependency clinical counselor, and peer recovery coach; patient navigators for Maine MOM (perinatal OUD program)

Enrollment: Opt-in enrollment

Geography: Statewide

Payment: Fee-for-service (FFS) PMPM
