Eligibility: Individuals with one or more SMI (adults) or SED (children)

Key Providers: Community Mental Health Services Programs (CMHSPs) operating under the Michigan Mental Health Code

Enrollment: Opt-out enrollment

Targeted Conditions: Chronic conditions including asthma, diabetes, heart disease, anxiety, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), depression, and hypertension

Eligibility: Individuals with two or more chronic conditions

Key Providers: Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs), Tribal Health Centers

Enrollment: Opt-out enrollment

Geography: 21 counties: Bay, Genesee, Houghton, Huron, Iron, Kalamazoo, Kent, Lapeer, Lenawee, Macomb, Marquette, Menominee, Monroe, Montcalm, Montmorency, Oakland, Ontonagon, Presque Isle, Saginaw, Shiawassee, Wayne

Payment: Fee-for-service (FFS) PMPM

SUD Model

Start Date: 10/1/18

Targeted Conditions: Opioid use disorder (OUD), alcohol use disorder (AUD), stimulant use disorder, mental health conditions, asthma, diabetes, heart disease, body mass index (BMI) over 25, COPD

Eligibility: Individuals with OUD, AUD, and/or stimulant use disorder who are also at risk for developing another chronic condition

Key Providers: Community Mental Health Center, FQHC/Primary Care Safety Net Clinic, Hospital based Physician Group, Opioid Treatment Program, Physician Based Clinic, Physician or Physician Practice, Rural Health Clinics, SUD Provider other than Opioid Treatment Program, Tribal Health Center

Enrollment: Hybrid autoenrollment process

| <u>MI-24-1501</u> | Approved: 9/25/24 Effective: 10/1/24 | Expands the opioid health home model to an additional seven counties and adds diagnoses of alcohol use disorder and stimulant use disorder in conjunction with MI-24-1002, allowing the model to expand to a SUD health home model |
