



## Medicaid Health Home State Profile: Nevada

As of March 2026, Nevada operates **one** health home model for **fetal alcohol spectrum disorder (FASD)**.

### FASD Model

**Start Date:** 10/1/25

**Targeted Conditions:** FASD, abnormal facial features, abnormal findings on functional studies of the peripheral nervous system and special senses, attention deficit hyperactivity disorder, autism spectrum disorder, cognitive delay, conduct disorder, chronic serous otitis media, expressive language disorder, externalizing disorders, low body weight, special learning disorders, pervasive and developmental disorders, intellectual disabilities, neurobehavioral disorders associated with prenatal exposures to alcohol, mood disorders, oppositional defiant disorder, psychotic disorders, receptive language disorder, speech and language delays, poor coordination, vision or hearing problems

**Eligibility:** FASD and at risk for developing chronic condition; FASD is defined as having a confirmed or probable prenatal exposure to alcohol through clinical or self-attestation and/or having one of the following diagnoses: (1) newborn affected by maternal use of alcohol (excluding fetal alcohol syndrome); or (2) fetal alcohol syndrome

**Key Providers:** FASD health home providers (e.g., health home directors, health home coordinators, care managers, care manager extenders)

**Enrollment:** Two-tier enrollment (claims based and provider recommendation)

**Geography:** Statewide

**Payment:** FFS PMPM
