



## Medicaid Health Home State Profile: Washington

As of March 2026, Washington operates **one** health home model for **chronic conditions**.

### **Chronic Conditions Model**

**Start Date:** 7/1/13

**Targeted Conditions:** Mental health conditions, substance use disorder, asthma, diabetes, heart disease, cancer, cerebrovascular disease, coronary artery disease, dementia or Alzheimer’s disease, gastrointestinal disease, hematological conditions, human immunodeficiency virus/acquired immunodeficiency syndrome, intellectual/developmental disabilities, musculoskeletal conditions, neurological conditions, chronic respiratory conditions, and renal failure

**Eligibility:** Individuals with one chronic condition and the risk of developing another based on a predictive risk score

**Key Providers:** Lead entities (Managed Fee-for-Service Lead Entity/Designated Provider or Medicaid Managed Care Organization (MCO), care coordination organizations (CCOs)

**Enrollment:** Opt-out

**Geography:** Statewide

**Payment:** Fee-for-service (FFS) rates for three levels of payment using a clinical and non-clinical staffing model combined with monthly service intensity; encounters are submitted per member, per month and include incentive payment for 1) primary care case management managed care; and 2) risk-based managed care
